






Do

- Have conversations with trusted adults who know you well to advise and guide you (parents, teachers, ECG Counsellor).
- Decide and act based on your options.

When you receive your results, you may experience a range of emotions.

Managing these emotions well will allow you to stay calm and make rational decisions.

How can we support one another?



- Deliberately avoiding others
- Increased irritability, restlessness, agitation, stress and anxiety
- Sending or posting moody messages on social media
- Talking about death or dying
- Reacting differently or gradually losing interest in things they used to like
- Eating more than usual or having a much reduced appetite
- Sleep pattern changes with difficulty falling asleep or oversleeping
- Slowing down of energy levels







JUST-IN-TIME INFORMATION ON JIE APPLICATION (JAN 2025 INTAKE)

Information For Students on Key Dates for Jan 2025 intake

- 1. All N(A)*/N(T) school leavers are encouraged to submit an application during the 1st Phase (Main Phase) between 16 Dec 2024 (2.30pm) to 19 Dec 2024 (5pm). Application results for the 1st Phase will be released on 30 Dec 2024 at 9am.
- 2. If you wish to appeal, please accept the course offered <u>before</u> applying in the **2nd Phase (Late Application/Appeal Phase)** between **30 Dec 2024 to 3 Jan 2025**. The application results for the 2nd Phase will be known on **10 Jan 2025 at 9am**.
- 3. Unsuccessful applicants can appeal under the 3rd Phase (Final Top-up Phase) between 10 Jan to 17 Jan 2025 and 23 Jan to 7 Feb 2025 for courses with vacancies. The application results for the 3rd Phase will be known between 14 Jan to 23 Jan 2025 and 23 Jan to 13 Feb 2025.

Key Pointers for Students on ITE's Joint Intake Exercise (JIE)

ALL students in N(T) and N(A) students (who are not progressing to 5N(A) or repeating 4N(A)) are eligible for UE.

Those who were unsuccessful in EAE are also eligible for JIE.

Use all 12 JIE choices wisely, as competition for 3-year Higher Nitec courses is keen!

Do consult your teachers / ECG counsellors to help you make your choices!

Do use the Last Aggregate Score (LAS) published in ITE's admission portal to help you make your course choices. If you have received an additional letter, then you are eligible for the Enhanced Foundation Programme (EFP).

If you are eligible for EFP, make sure you apply for both the EFP and the 2-year Nitec/3-year Higher

The EFP helps to build the necessary literacy and numeracy foundations that will enable you to successfully complete your course!

If you are counter-offered a course, accept it first before appealing for another course you may be more interested in!

Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP)

Instead of progressing to Sec 5N(A), students may consider enrolling directly into two year Higher Nitec courses at ITE through the Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP).

DPP students who successfully complete their Higher Nitec courses and attain the minimum qualifying Grade Point Average (GPA) are subsequently guaranteed a place in a polytechnic diploma course mapped to their Higher Nitec course.

Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP)

- 4N(A) students may apply for the DPP if they satisfy <u>all</u> the following criteria:-
- (a) Sat for their GCE N(A)-Level Examination in 2024 as school candidates;
- (b) Obtained an ELMAB3 aggregate scores of 19 points or less (excluding CCA bonus points); and
- (c) Meet subject-specific entry requirements for each course

Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP)

The PFP is a diploma-specific foundation programme conducted over two academic semesters at the polytechnics by polytechnic staff. Students who successfully complete the PFP will progress to the first year of their chosen diploma course in the same polytechnic.

- 4N(A) students may apply for the PFP if they satisfy <u>all</u> the following criteria:-
- (a) Sat for their GCE N(A)-Level Examination in 2024 as school candidates;
- (b) Obtained an ELMAB3 aggregate scores of 12 points or less (excluding CCA bonus points)
- (c) Meet the subject-specific entry requirements.

Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP)

Following the release of the GCE O-Level results in January 2025, PFP-eligible students may submit their applications online via the PFP portal at https://pfp.polytechnic.edu.sg/PFP/pfp application.html

PFP / DPP

- (a) Students who are only interested in applying for the PFP should first progress to Sec 5N(A), even if they meet the PFP eligibility criteria based on their GCE N(A)-Level results in December 2024. They may then apply for the PFP upon release of the GCE O-Level results in January 2025. If their application is successful, they will withdraw from Sec 5N(A) by the end of January 2025. All PFP-bound students are required to attend Sec 5N(A) classes in their secondary schools up till the last Friday of January 2025, i.e. 31 January 2025.
- b) Students who are only interested in applying for the DPP should do so once they receive their GCE N(A)-Level results in December 2024. Should they accept a DPP offer, they will not be required to return to their secondary schools for Sec 5N(A).

PFP / DPP

(c) Students who are interested in applying for both the PFP and DPP are encouraged to consider carefully their interests and strengths, as well as the courses offered under both programmes.

One option for students who are interested in both the PFP and DPP is to first progress to Sec 5N(A) and then apply for both the PFP and DPP upon release of the GCE O-Level examination results in January 2024.

Students who are offered a place in both the PFP and DPP may only accept one course offer. Students who accept both offers will have both offers voided. If their application to either the PFP or DPP is successful, they will withdraw from Sec 5N(A) by the end of January 2025.

For students who have already <u>applied for and accepted their DPP offer prior to the release of the GCE O-Level examination results, their secondary school will contact them to collect the PFP eligibility form (Form P) if they are eligible for PFP after the release of the <u>GCE O-Level results.</u></u>

For students who decide to apply for and accept their PFP offer in January, they will need to apply for withdrawal from the DPP course. Applicants can apply for a refund of his/her DPP enrolment fees, subject to ITE's approval.

Students who wish to repeat in Sec 4N(A) in 2025 must report to School with their parents on Tuesday 17 Dec at 10.30 am to meet Mr Xu Kaibin at the General Office.

Please inform Mr Xu in the hall today by 4 pm should you wish to repeat in Sec 4N(A) in 2025.

- This comprises a review of the marking and a full clerical re-check.
 - No report on the candidate's performance will be provided.
- The candidate will be informed of the outcome via a letter by 3 Feb 2025.

DIRECT-ENTRY-SCHEME TO POLYTECHNIC PROGRAMME (DPP)

5 Things You Need to Know

1. What is the DPP?

- Prepares Sec 4N(A) students for progression into selected polytechnic diploma courses via a 2-year Higher Nitec programme at ITE, and a 10-week DPP preparatory course > Serves as an alternative to Sec 5
- DPP students who meet the minimum qualifying GPA score are guaranteed a place in a polytechnic diploma course mapped to the *Higher Nitec* course. (Refer to https://www.ite.edu.sg/admissions/full-time-courses/highernitec-dpp for course mapping.)
- On About 1,200 places offered across 18 Higher Nitec courses

2. Am I eligible for DPP?

- ☐ Sec 4N(A) student who has sat for GCE N-Level exams in 2024
- ☐ Obtained ELMAB3 aggregate of 19 points or less (before deduction of CCA bonus points)
- ☐ Meet course-specific entry requirements
- If you can check all 3 boxes above, you're eligible! (Note: Eligibility does not quarantee placement.)

If you have offered GCE O-Level examination subjects in 2024, you may refer to this table for the equivalent grade to compute your ELMAB3 aggregate:

3. How do I apply?

- Upon release of the GCE N-Level results, all DPP-eligible students may apply for DPP Higher Nitec courses via the ITE website (https://www.ite.edu.sg).
- You may select up to 12 course choices.
- Remember to provide updated contact details in your application so that ITE can contact you if necessary.

4. How will I know the outcome?

- You should check your DPP posting results online on the morning of the release of the DPP posting results.
- You will then have to indicate if you wish to accept/reject/appeal the offer.
- Your offer will be void if you do not accept the offer by the stipulated date. You will be required to continue with your classes in Sec 5, or with your Nitec / Higher Nitec course if your application via JIE 'N' is successful

5. What happens next?

Upon accepting your DPP offer, you will attend a 10-week DPP preparatory programme starting from Jan 2025.

POLYTECHNIC FOUNDATION PROGRAMME (PFP)

Essential Things You Need to Know

1. What is the PFP?

- A foundation year at the polytechnics that:
 - Prepares well-performing Sec 4N(A) students for entry into relevant polytechnic diploma courses
 - Serves as an alternative to Sec 5
- Conducted over two academic semesters at the polytechnics
- Students must pass all PFP modules in order to progress to their respective, pre-selected diploma courses.

2. Am I eligible for PFP 2025?

You are eligible for the PFP if you:

- ☐ Sat for GCE N-Level exams as a school candidate in 2024
- ☐ Have obtained an ELMAB3 aggregate of 12 points or less (before deduction of CCA bonus points)
- ☐ Met subject-specific entry requirements as listed on the PFP portal

If you can check all 3 boxes above, you're eligible!

(Note: Eligibility does <u>not</u> guarantee you a place in a PFP course)

If you had offered GCE O-Level examination subjects in 2024, you may refer to this table for the equivalent grade to compute your ELMAB3 aggregate:

GCE 'O' Level Grade	Converted Grade
A1-B3	1
B4-C6	2
D7	3
E8	4

3. How do I apply?

- Upon release of the GCE O-Level results, all PFPeligible students will receive Form P containing a PFP PIN that allows them to apply for the PFP at this <u>link</u>.
- You may select up to five course choices.
- Remember to provide updated contact details in your application to allow the polytechnics to contact you if necessary.


(Note: You should continue to attend Sec 5 from 2
January 2025 while applying for PFP.)

4. How will I be informed of the outcome?

- You should log in to the PFP portal to check your application outcomes on the day of PFP posting results release.
- You will then have to indicate if you wish to accept/reject/appeal the offer.
- If you do not select any option, your offer will become invalid and you will be required to continue with your classes in Sec 5/DPP.
 (Note: If your appeal is successful, your original offer will be voided, regardless of whether you accept the new PFP offer.)

5. What happens next?

- If you accept your offer, you will receive an enrolment package from the polytechnic in February/March 2025.
- The PFP year will start in April 2025.

3. During JIE Appeals

Can I appeal for transfer to another course? What should I do if I am undecided over what courses to choose?



If you have received a course offer, consider accepting the offer. Following that, you can submit an appeal for an alternative course if you like to request for a change.

While all eligible appeals for transfer will be given due consideration, meeting the minimum entry requirements does not guarantee a place in the course as admission is also subject to available vacancies in open competition.
